



#### From the desk of the pastor...

There is a story in the book of Elizabeth Brenner, entitled "Winning by Letting Go". Brenner explains how people in India catch monkeys—and catch them alive. They cut a small hole in a box. Then they put a tasty nut in the box. The hole is just large enough for the monkey to put its hand through. But it's too small for the monkey to withdraw its hand once it has clutched the nut inside. So, the monkey has two choices. It can let go of the nut and go free, or it can hold on to the nut and stay trapped. Monkeys usually hold on to the nut.

The monkey is a good image of us (not physically, of course, but spiritually), and the nut represents things, vices and people, which we cannot let go. Consequently, we are not free. We're trapped.

The gospel message of this 13th Sunday is about the failure of the three men who offer to become disciples but could not let go of their attachments.

The first man could not follow the Lord due to the economic uncertainty involved. Jesus said that discipleship or following him entailed material deprivation: "The foxes have holes...but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head" (cf. Lk 9;57 ff).

Material deprivation does not necessarily mean depriving ourselves of our material resources but can mean sharing them with the less fortunate or sharing our time to visit the sick and elderly.

The second and third men turned their backs on Jesus' call because of family obligations ("I will follow you, Lord, but let me first bury the dead;" "let me say goodbye to my family").

Jesus rebukes the second, saying: "Let the dead bury their dead." Jesus is calling attention to the tragedy of life of the unseized moments or resolutions that are put off.

The moment passes, and the thing is never done.

We need to examine our conscience to find out what those things are which keep us away from the Lord otherwise, like that monkey in the story, we cannot be freed. We're trapped by our own sins and vices.

#### SYNODAL PROCESS SYNTHESIS, What We Heard

The synodal conversations were rich both online through the Diocesan and parish survey links and in-person for groups gathering in parishes, parish halls, schools, campuses, or elsewhere. The amount of input, feedback, and heartfelt engagement was outstanding, especially given the ongoing challenges posed by the pandemic.

The Synodal Process Synthesis from the Roman Catholic Diocese of Peterborough was submitted to the Assembly of Catholic Bishops of Ontario (ACBO) on Friday, June 17, 2022, as required. The ACBO will be collating the Synthesis documents from the ON Arch/Dioceses and forwarding them to the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops ( CCCB ) and then to the Vatican.
