

From the desk of the pastor...

A lonely widow went to a big pet shop to buy a prize talking parrot.

"This will cheer me up," she muttered. Several days went by and the parrot hadn't uttered a sound. She went back to pet shop owner and complained. "What it needs is a ladder for the cage," the man said. "When it goes up and down, it'll start talking." But the parrot didn't utter a word. So, the widow returned and complained.

"Ah, what it needs is a swing," the owner said. But a week went by, and still the bird didn't talk. Another week passed and the woman went back to the pet store, this time mournful. She reported inconsolably that the expensive parrot had died. The owner was embarrassed, "Didn't it say anything at all?"

"Yes," said the widow. "As it drew its last breaths, it said feebly: "Don't they have bird food in the pet store?" The owner was so preoccupied with the bird's various needs that she forgot the one most basic — food!

"I am the bread of life," Jesus tells us in this **18th Sunday's gospel**. Just as we need food to live, Jesus teaches that we need food for our souls, too.

He wanted to tell us that aside from the food which we need to satisfy our bodies, we must nourish our souls, too. Thus, Jesus decided to dwell within the bread of the Eucharist with all His power to become the nourishment of our souls.

"Don't work for the food that perishes but work for the food of eternal life," Christ admonishes. Obviously, He does not mean we shouldn't work anymore, or indulge in socials and recreation or fend for material security. What He's saying is that we should not forget or neglect an equally important need in our life, the spiritual.

The need for God is very real. As one movie celebrity once related, "When I had an accident and got critically burned, I wasn't thinking of my bank account but of God. I desperately prayed to survive."

"I am the bread of eternal life," Jesus says. In Him is our ultimate happiness, our ultimate fulfillment and ultimate security. As the great St. Augustine once said borne out of his own experience: "My heart is restless, O Lord, until it rests in you."

<u>Update to Lockdown</u> <u>Measures</u>



The Ontario provincial government announced that the province will be moving into Step 3 of the Reopening Strategy as of 12:01 a.m., Friday July 16, 2021.

In Step 3, there is no capacity limit for churches and missions. However, physical distancing of 2 metres (6 feet) is still required between parishioners attending Mass who are not from the same household.

There is no need for contact tracing at the services in the church or mission unless there is a funeral. (See the section below for funerals.)

- Currently, face mask use indoors is mandatory for the celebrants and the faithful, even for those who are fully vaccinated.
- Congregational singing is not permitted in Step 3.
- A cantor or small choir may be utilized if singers/musicians are 3 metres from one another and any member of the congregation. Singers/musicians from the same household do not have to distance themselves from one another.
- One altar server or two or more altar servers from the same household are permitted at a Mass. Face masks must be worn, and physical distancing maintained.
- The celebrant's regular practice for greeting parishioners and processing at the beginning and the end of the liturgy may resume with adherence to the health precautions.

FUNERALS

For funerals in Step 3, the Bereavement Authority of Ontario has issued the following guidelines:

Indoor Funeral Services

Indoor funeral services are permitted with the physical distancing of two metres (six feet) between people.

Contact tracing information must be collected. Records must be kept for 30 days.

All attendees and staff must adhere to local public health unit restrictions.
