



From the desk of the pastor...

Please continue to hold to those precious beads as we pray the Rosary!

Prayer had a great importance in the life and teaching of Jesus Christ. He often prayed. He went out to secluded places to pray very early in the morning and he prayed at night.

Prayer was, for Jesus, a customary way of "keeping in touch" with the Father and asking His enlightenment and help for his disciples. His habit of praying prompted his disciples to ask him to teach them how to pray. In response he taught them (and all mankind) the "Our Father". From it, we learn that the first thing that we should do when we pray is to give God the adoration, praise and submission to his will. Our needs, both material and spiritual, come next as we humbly and trustingly request that He may grant us all the graces that we need and yearn for.

God will surely not leave unheeded our prayers of petition offered with faith and a humble heart. This, however, does not mean that He will necessarily do "on the spot" what we are requesting, for God may have other plans — a more comprehensive and "long-term" plan for us and the people we pray for.

Jesus experienced how painful God's "delay" and "alternative plan" may be for a time. That's why, after repeatedly saying, "Father, if it is possible, let this cup (of suffering) pass from me," he concluded, "yet, not my will but yours be done!" The Father's "answer" came in Jesus' glorious resurrection and ascension into heaven, which opened the gates of heaven for all!

Instead of "snatching" from God whatever we want, regardless of what His plan may be, let us not ignore or forget what Jesus exhorted his disciples, "to pray always without becoming weary".

Prayer has to be rooted in a firm but also humble faith in God. Such faith implies to "let God be God," and the believers' determination that God's will "be done on earth as it is in heaven." Without such premise, there can be no authentic prayer, but only a travesty of devotion which is rooted in ignorance, arrogance and pride.

4 Reasons to Pray the Rosary

1. For an increase in **FAITH**

Praying the Rosary helps us to become more **grounded** in our faith in God.

2. For an increase in HOPE

The prayer of the Rosary can help us find the kind of hope that **sustains** us. We can feel hopeful even when God seems far away or when life seems overwhelming.

3. For an increase in **LOVE**

When we pray out of love for God, our hearts change. As we meditate on the events and prayers, they become more meaningful to us. As a result, our love can grow and become more genuine.

4. For an increase in **JOY**

We **prepare our hearts** to receive God's grace and joy when we pray.
