


From the Desk of the Pastor: Easter Message

Alleluia is our song!

This Sunday is Easter Sunday. We celebrate on Sunday Christ's resurrection from the dead. The Church proclaims that on this day, Jesus Christ broke the chains of death and rose triumphant from the grave. Easter is thus the most important celebration in the Church as it celebrates Christ's triumph over sin and death.

The Church is built on the foundation of the resurrection of Jesus. Saint Augustine said the resurrection of Jesus is our hope. Christ rose from death to tell us that after all the sufferings we have endured and the pains that have been inflicted upon us, like Him we will triumph over these things if we only put our trust in God. He lived a life of obedience to the Father and was faithful to the mission given to Him. If we look at the Risen Christ, we have reason to hope.

Pope Benedict XVI tells us that on that first Easter morning, everything was made new. It is a is a newness that changes the lives of those who accept it. Saint Paul, referred to his meeting the Risen Jesus Himself on His way to Damascus, said: "If anyone is in Christ, He is a new creation; the old has passed away, behold, the new has come" (2 Cor 5:17). Paul, a zealous apostle, was never ashamed to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

This "new life" experience may also happen to each one of us if we are willing to be conquered by the Risen Christ. The Easter celebration is a celebration of hope. We may all enjoy the benefits of Christ's resurrection if we are open to God's grace. Let us allow ourselves to be touched by the grace of Jesus who was raised from death. With Mary, the Mother of the Redeemer, our hearts cry out with joy: Alleluia!

LIVE-STREAMING OF THE MASS

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum. The Easter Triduum liturgically unfolds for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery. The celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.

The liturgical services that take place during the Triduum are as follows and will be celebrated at the Cathedral of St. Peter-in-Chains (Peterborough) on the dates and times noted:

- Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday on April 14th at 7 pm
- Good Friday of the Lord's Passion on April 15th at 3 pm
- Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord on Holy Saturday on April 16th at 8 pm

And on Easter Sunday, the Mass will be live-streamed from the Cathedral of St. Peter-in-Chains on April 17th at 10:30 am.

COVID-19 UPDATE

Updates on Covid-19 Health precautions as of March 21, 2021:

- Indoor masking requirements are lifted in churches, parish halls and offices starting on Monday, March 21, 2022.
- Churches can currently rent their halls, and food/drink can currently be served in halls.
- Starting Monday, March 21, all Covid-19 health precautions are lifted in parish halls
- Starting on Monday, March 21, health precautions on choir activities are lifted.
- Clergy and lay staff who have a Covid-19 close contact or who experience symptoms or test positive for the Covid-19 virus are reminded to continue following the current health unit guidelines and provincial regulations that apply to close contacts, the onset of symptoms or a positive test result.
