


From the Desk of the Pastor...

The 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C teaches us about holiness and discipleship through Peter's encounter with Jesus. Peter, a fisherman, listens to Jesus and experiences a miraculous catch of fish. Despite feeling unworthy, Peter follows Jesus, leaving everything behind. This Gospel shows that growing in holiness requires saying yes to Jesus, working hard and trusting God despite our imperfections. God calls us to follow Him and grow in our relationship with Him. Saying "Yes" to God's call can lead to amazing blessings.

The 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time helps us understand what we need to leave behind to follow Jesus. Just as the disciples left their nets, which symbolized their livelihood and security, we are called to let go of things that hinder our spiritual growth. These "nets" can be habits, possessions or relationships that keep us from a closer relationship with Jesus. Reflect on what might be holding you back and consider how abandoning these things can help you follow Christ more fully.

This week let us pray with deep gratitude for God's constant presence and care. We are all important to our Heavenly Father despite our seeming insignificance. God is near us, protecting us in times of danger and listening to us always.

World Day of Sick 2025

February 11 is World Day of the Sick, an observation started by Pope John Paul II as a way for believers to offer prayers for those suffering from illnesses. This day coincides with the commemoration of Our Lady of Lourdes.

Commemorate World Day of the Sick

People around the world take the time to pray for the sick and for those who work very hard to alleviate the sufferings of the sick on this day.

About World Day of the Sick

Pope John Paul II initiated this day in 1992 to encourage people to pray for those who suffer from illness and for their caregivers. The Pope himself had been diagnosed with
Parkinson's a year before, in 1991, and it is considered that his own illness was impetus for his designation of the day.
World Day of the Sick was first observed on February 11, 1993.
February 11 is also the Catholic Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, which a name is given to the Virgin Mary in honour of the apparitions that were said to have been seen in and around Lourdes, France, by a young girl called Bernadette Soubirous.
The Church canonized Bernadette as a saint several years later.





February 9th - World Marriage Day

World Marriage Day (WMD) honours husband and wife as the foundation of the family – the basic unit of society. It salutes the beauty of their faithfulness, sacrifice and joy in daily married life.

History

The idea of celebrating marriage began in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, in 1981, when couples encouraged the mayor, the governor and the Bishop to proclaim St. Valentine's Day as "We Believe in Marriage Day." The event was so successful, the idea was presented to and adopted by Worldwide Marriage Encounter's National Leadership.

By 1982, 43 governors officially proclaimed the day and celebrations spread to U.S. military bases in several foreign countries. In 1983, the name was changed to "World Marriage Day," designated to be celebrated each year on the second Sunday in February. In 1993, his Holiness, Pope John Paul II, imparted his Apostolic Blessings on World Marriage Day (WMD). WMD celebrations continue to grow and spread to more countries and faith expressions every year.

Symbol

Our World Marriage Day Symbol speaks readily of the role and values we proclaim. Husband and wife are symbolically seen as two candle-like figures, reminding us that married love calls us to help enlighten the world.

The couple is joined by a heart, focusing on love as the power that fosters unity within the couple and generates the capacity to be life-giving and inspire others to fruitfulness and unity.

Theme

The theme for WMD has been permanently adopted as "Love One Another." This phrase is the commandment given us by Jesus in John 15:12. It speaks to us in a simple but challenging way of how our Father wishes us to live. Loving one another is a daily decision, simple but challenging.
