



From the desk of the pastor...

It's 5th Sunday of Lent!

Valuable items have a high price. Important achievements are the crowning of courage, determination, effort and perseverance. Medals, whether gained in sports, civil service, or war time, are never a formality. Behind that small piece of metal there lies a world of self-sacrifice and dedication.

In our existence on earth, there is nothing more precious than our spiritual life. Our spiritual life – the best part of our "selves" – is more like a seed than like a diamond. Every seed has immense (often unsuspected) potentialities: endless riches of colours, flowers, fruits, life. All these will come to light, the richness that is "within" will be made visible only if the seed undergoes the process of transformation which, in many aspects, is a form of "death." This "miracle" in fact, will happen only if the shell opens up and rots away, and even the internal part is consumed and "disappears" in order for the tender shoot to sprout and grow to fullness.

The best part of us is often wrapped in a shell of "ordinariness" and defects like wrong attachments to ourselves, other people or the material world; resentments, grudges, envy, lust, pride. These defects are like fetters that cripple us and hamper the development of our personality and spiritual life. If we really mean to attain a new life, or enjoy a fuller life, we must rid ourselves of them with the help of God's grace.

The "new life" will flower in us only at the cost of the death of our lower, sinful "selves." This is the meaning of Christ's saying: "The man who loves his life loses it, while the man who hates his life in this world preserves it to life eternal" (Jn 12:25).

Jesus lived this teaching out and paid the price which this principle entails: "Son though he was, Jesus learned obedience from what he suffered and when perfected, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him" (Heb 5:8f).

That was a wonderful fruit indeed, sprouting from the seed of his life given us. We can share in it only if we accept to share in his self-offering and death.

Holy Week: New Guidelines and Restrictions

The celebration of the Holy Week Liturgies this year will entail some challenges and additional precautions. Please see the changes listed below which describe the manner in which those liturgies are to be celebrated at our parishes.

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

- Palms may be distributed by an usher who is masked and gloved.
- Palms may be sprinkled, but the priest should not walk through the church unless he is masked.

Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper

- The optional washing of the feet following the homily is omitted.
- Following the Distribution of Holy Communion, ciboria with sufficient hosts for the next day are left on the altar.
- Following the Prayer after Communion, the priest should kneel before the altar and incense the Blessed Sacrament, allowing for several minutes of adoration. Afterwards the priest (and other ministers as necessary) takes the ciboria directly to the sacristy where the Blessed Sacrament is to be reserved. There is no solemn procession with the Blessed Sacrament at the conclusion of the Mass.
- The congregation leaves the church immediately after the departure of the ministers from the sanctuary. There is no period of adoration following the reservation of the Blessed Sacrament.

Good Friday - The Celebration of the Lord's Passion

- The Cross is processed from the sacristy to the sanctuary and may be led by two acolytes with candles. The priest takes the Cross and faces the people. If the Cross is veiled, he unveils it using the traditional formula. (Roman Missal p. 309). If the Cross is not veiled, he shows it to the people three times using the formula, "Behold the wood of the Cross, on which hung the salvation of the world." The people respond: "Come let us adore."
- The Cross is placed in a stand or on a table with lighted candles on each side. The priest and people kneel for a moment of silent prayer and then the priest alone kisses the Cross before proceeding to the Altar for the Communion rite.
- The altar is prepared, and the Communion Rite takes place as in the Roman Missal, page 317 ff. Communion is distributed in the usual manner in accordance with pandemic protocols.
- Following the Prayer after Communion and the Prayer over the People, the priest returns directly to the sacristy.
- Where it is customary or deemed pastorally necessary, an additional celebration of the Passion may take place.

Easter Vigil

- Gathering around a fire is not permitted and worshippers should remain in their pews. A simple Easter fire may be prepared inside
 or just outside the church doors from which the Paschal candle is lighted.
- The blessing of the fire and the lighting of the candle, and the Easter Proclamation take place as in the Roman Missal, pp. 324-344. Candles for the assembly may be used, provided they take them with them following the liturgy.

Easter Sunday Masses

 Easter Sunday Masses are celebrated as usual, including the Renewal of Baptism Promises (RM, p. 361) which takes the place of the Creed. The priest may sprinkle the assembly with holy water afterwards but should be masked if he leaves the sanctuary to do so
