


From the desk of the pastor...

Greetings!

Sometimes some people are tempted to "box" other persons. They think that others can only grow that much. If the size of the "box" is dependent on the size of their biased hearts and prejudiced minds, then how small could that box be? That tells why their perceptions of other people are too negative. They believe that others cannot be greater than who they think they are.

Sometimes it is not only the "size" of the box that matters. It is also the "shape" of the box that hurts us more. COVID-19 UPDATE

In the Diocese of Peterborough, Most Reverend Bishop Miehm has provided these guidelines for the implementation of the health precautions:

- Households attending the church must maintain a physical distance of 6 feet or 2 metres between each other. Attendance at the church is limited to fifty percent of the church's posted capacity.
- The clergy and the faithful must wear a face mask in the church.
- Congregational singing is strongly discouraged at this time.
- The processional and recessional will take place respectively from the sacristy to the sanctuary and from the sanctuary to the sacristy to avoid gatherings at the church doors.
- Parish Halls are closed for the time being. The exception to this closure is AA meetings, Food Banks and other designated entities.
- The Diocesan and Parish Staff are working remotely as much as possible.

It is hoped that these new measures will curtail or significantly mitigate the current surge of the Omicron variant and the COVID-19 virus.
