

<u>Update to</u> Lockdown Measures



Effective January 7, 2021, priests have permission to celebrate Daily Mass in the parishes of the Diocese of Peterborough during the period of provincial lockdown because of COVID-19.

Priests must ensure that the maximum number of 10 attendees (including the celebrant) is not exceeded as per the provincial regulation.

It is also essential to adhere to all of the safety and social distancing protocols that have been put in place and that are described in our *Worship Safe* manual.

There is to be no public celebration of the Sunday Mass during the period of lockdown. Parishes that are livestreaming the Mass on Sunday may do so, with attendance limited to those necessary to assist in the liturgy and the broadcast, not exceeding the provincial maximum of 10 people.

Regular Sunday Masses will resume on Sunday January 24th, 2021. If lockdown measures are extended further communication will be distributed to parishioners.
