

#### From the desk of the pastor...

A despondent man complained to his mother, saying: "I've stopped going to church for two reasons: I don't like the people, and the people don't like me."

The mother gazed at him compassionately and said: "My son, you should go back to church; I'll also give you two reasons why: You're already 59 years old, and you are the parish priest!"

When the Lord started His ministry, He called a core group: Peter and Andrew, James and John, and others to become henceforth "fishers of men" (Mk 1:17).And like that despondent parish priest in the story, these chosen followers were to continue Christ's mission after He had ascended to heaven regardless of whether the people like them or not.

The Decreee on the Laity of Vatican II states: "Incorporated into Christ's Mystical Body through baptism and strengthened by the power of the Holy Spirit through confirmation, the laity are assigned to the apostolate by the Lord himself" (3).

Today we know of more and more numerous lay Catholics who sacrifice time, treasure, and talent for the church. The most basic and effective form of being a "fisher" is through the TESTIMONY of Christian living.

The British TV journalist Malcolm Muggeridge was a celebrity who did not care much about God and religion. He did something he swore he would never do – become a Catholic. What led to his conversion? He was assigned to write about the late Mother Teresa of Calcutta. Travelling to India, Muggeridge thought the trip was just the usual work but the amazing thing was in the course of his talks and days of observation of the kindly nun, he experienced a change of heart.

Muggeridge said: "Words cannot express how much I owe her. She showed me Christianity in action... She showed me how one loving person can start a tidal wave of love that can spread to the entire world."

# <u>Update to</u> <u>Lockdown Measures</u>



Premier Doug Ford has declared a second provincial emergency which went into effect yesterday and the Premier has also issued a Stay-at-Home Order which goes into effect on Thursday, January 14, 2021, at 12:01 a.m. The State of Provincial Emergency and the Stay-at-Home Order will remain in effect until February 10, 2021.

Here is a summary of the implications for churches of the State of Emergency and the Stay-at-Home Order.

- The limit for the celebration of Daily Mass, Weddings, and Funerals is **10 including the celebrant and liturgical ministers**.
- No gatherings for meetings or organizations will take place in the parish hall.
- All health precautions previously issued remain in force:
  - Limit of 10 people including the priest and all liturgical ministers
    - Sanitation and hygiene practices at the church
    - Signage for entrances, exits, use of hand sanitizers, physical distancing, wearing face masks, etc.
    - Distinct doorways for entering and exiting
    - No public celebration of Sunday Masses at this time.
    - Permission has been given for the priest to celebrate a public Daily Mass if he determines that all the health precautions can be put in place.
    - Clear procedures for the distribution of Holy Communion
    - Face masks are always required in places of worship (this includes the celebrant) and worksites in the province of Ontario.
