From the desk of the pastor...

The presence and aggressiveness of moral evil in a world ruled by God's Providence is bewildering. This feeling of confusion increases when we see evil right within the Church itself, which is supposed to be the beginning and the "sign" of the Kingdom.

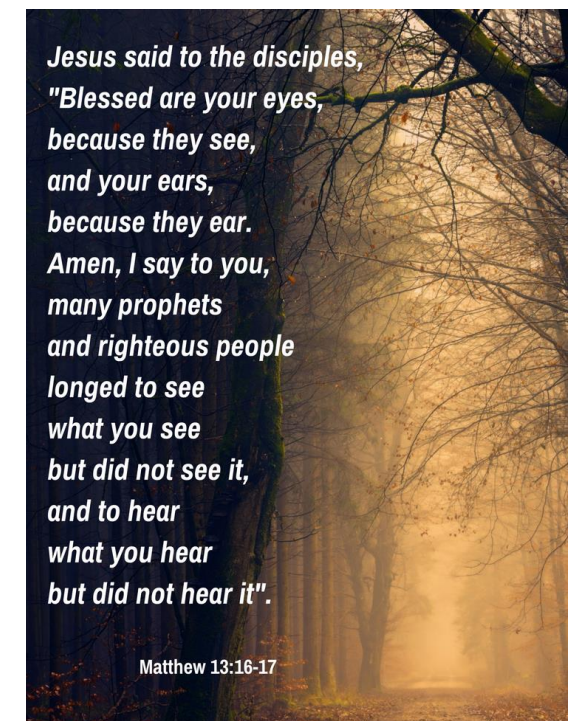
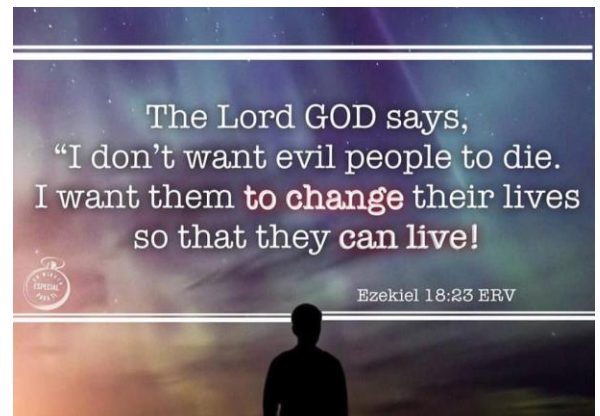
What bewilders us most is the impression that God does not seem alarmed by this situation. Why does He tolerate the devastating presence of evil in the world and in the Church? The basic answer to this question is that God wants the conversion of sinners, not their death. (See Ez 18:23 and 33:11.) But conversion is a long process....In the meantime God derives good even from evil.

This "permission" that evil continue may be a means to test the faithfulness of His children, to challenge them to "grow," to bring them to be vigilant and humble. God allows evil in order to draw from good people manifestations of a love which is absolutely sincere.

Evil is not just around us. It may be also right within each one of us, in different degrees and often well concealed. But there, nonetheless, always ready to grow and strike . . .

God is patient but not impotent. He is loving and merciful, but also just. In the end, goodness and justice must prevail and will prevail. God will be the one to have the final word. In spite of the great noise evil can do, God remains in full control of the situation. He knows when to declare "time's up!" That will be judgment time, and everyone will be rewarded according to his/her deeds. (See Mt 13:42-43 and 16:27.)

Such is the teaching of the parable of the wheat and the weeds.

MASS INTENTIONS UPDATE FOR OUR LADY QUEEN OF PEACE & ST. ALOYSIUS

What is a 'Mass Intention'?

The tradition of Masses offered for the intentions of living or deceased loved ones originated in the very early Church and continues to be an important Catholic practice. For us who believe that the Mass is the perfect prayer, no greater gift can be offered for our loved ones, living and deceased, who may still need the help of our prayers. Priests are under a strict obligation to remember in a special way the person for whom the Mass is being offered.

Masses are often requested for a loved one who has recently died or on the anniversary of a death. However, the gift of a Mass intention is also a wonderful way to offer prayers on the event of a wedding anniversary, a birthday, an anniversary of ordination or entrance into religious life. Masses may also be offered for the intentions of a person about to undergo surgery, who is recuperating from an illness, who wishes to overcome addiction, sin or has some other special need. Masses may be offered in thanksgiving for blessings, family, health and answer to prayers.

Cost of a Mass Intention

We offer announced or unannounced Masses for your loved ones. According to diocesan guidelines the standard offering for an "Announced Mass" Intention is \$20.00. An "Unannounced Mass" Intention can be offered for \$10.00. Of course, no one "purchases" a Mass - no one Mass "belongs" to any one person. The Mass is offered for all. But it is permissible for a priest to celebrate the Mass for any intention. Priests can offer more than one intention at a Mass on any given day. Please note that \$5 of each Mass intention collected is deposited to the 'Priest Benefit Fund'.

"Announced" vs "Unannounced" Mass

An Announced Mass will be placed on a scheduled day and time and be listed in the bulletin. The intention is also mentioned in the Prayers of the Faithful during the Mass. An Unannounced Mass means the intentions are not announced, but are known to the priest and included in his celebration of the Mass. They will be mentioned in the Prayers of the Faithful on the day the intention is offered. A Mass Card can be provided indicating the intention to be celebrated and the date and time of the Mass.


How to Purchase a Mass Intention

Please contact the parish office to schedule a Mass Intention. Payment can be made in cash, cheque or e-transfer.
