


Making sense of it all!

Thanks to the Risen Christ himself, the disciples were able to understand that all that had happened to him was in fulfillment of what the prophets had foretold. They finally understood that it was part of God's plan to save all. Likewise, His resurrection was God's mighty work, the crowning fulfillment of all prophecies.

From that moment on, especially after Jesus' ascension into heaven, the Scriptures became for the believers a continuous reminder of their crucified and risen Lord, and a privileged "place" where they could find him. By reading it, they could realize the faithfulness of God to His promises, and once again experience the presence of the glorified Christ among them.

It should be so even for us and for all generations of believers. We know we can encounter the risen Lord in many ways, particularly in the sacraments, and most especially in the Eucharist. But we can and should encounter him also in the Sacred Scriptures. These are not simply books about Jesus. The message they contain is the Word of God. Christ is present in the inspired pages with his lifegiving power. And we can experience his saving presence not only when the Scriptures are proclaimed in the liturgy, but also when we read

them at home with the rest of the family or by ourselves. What matters is a humble, prayerful and open heart to receive the Word, understand it in the light of the teaching of the Church and apply it to our lives with the help of the Holy Spirit.

With such dispositions, every day can become an Easter day.

Update to Lockdown Measures



Below is the Information from the Bishop concerning new restrictions announced Friday April 16th for the Province of Ontario.

PETERBOROUGH, CENTRAL AND SOUTHERN DEANERIES

Effective Monday, April 19, 2021, priests may celebrate weekday Mass for a maximum of 10 people including the celebrant and liturgical ministers, if the pastor deems it safe and feasible. There is to be no public celebration of the Sunday but Mass may be celebrated for the purpose of livestreaming with adherence to the capacity limit of ten (including the celebrant, technicians, and liturgical ministers).

- **OTHER LITURGICAL RITES:** Baptisms, weddings and funerals may proceed observing the capacity limit of 10 people.
- **HEALTH PRECAUTIONS:** All health precautions must be observed including the requirement to maintain contact tracing records.
- **STAY WITHIN YOUR REGION.** Travel outside of the jurisdiction must be curtailed unless absolutely necessary.
- VACCINATION Encourage parishioners to read the materials about the COVID-19 vaccination and to get vaccinated when they are eligible. <u>https://www.peterboroughdiocese.org/en/how-do-ifind/covid-19-update.aspx</u>
