

### From the desk of the pastor...

#### Greetings!

Jesus told this parable: "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came seeking fruit on it and found none. And he said to the vinedresser, 'Lo, these three years I have come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and I find none. Cut it down; why should it use up the ground?' And he answered him, 'Let it alone, sir, this year also, till I dig about it and put on manure. And if it bears fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down.'" (Luke 13:6-9)

This parable of Jesus depicts the patience of God with us, but it also contains a warning that we should not presume upon it. God gives us time to get right with Him and to bear good fruit in our lives, but that time is now. A sudden life-threatening illness and unexpected death leaves us no time to settle our accounts when each of us must stand before the Lord on that day of judgment. Jesus warns us for our own good so we will be always fruitful and ready. If we delay, we may discover that grace has passed us by, and our time is up.

Lent is indeed that time of the year during which we can apply for God's assistance to bring us more and more to life. More life means more daily actions of being who we are and letting go of those destructive habits and desires.

We apply for this help through the sacraments, personal prayer, and allowing Lent to be the "joyful season" of our coming alive to being God's new creation again.

# **COVID-19 UPDATE**

#### Updates on Covid-19 Health precautions as of March 21, 2021:

- Indoor masking requirements are lifted in churches, parish halls and offices starting on Monday, March 21, 2022.
- Churches can currently rent their halls, and food/drink can currently be served in halls.
- Starting Monday, March 21, all Covid-19 health precautions are lifted in parish halls
- Starting on Monday, March 21, health precautions on choir activities are lifted.
- Clergy and lay staff who have a Covid-19 close contact or who experience symptoms or test positive for the Covid-19 virus are reminded to continue following the current health unit guidelines and provincial regulations that apply to close contacts, the onset of symptoms or a positive test result.
